SIGNIFICANCE

- An estimated 19.7 million children under the age of one year did not receive basic vaccines (World Health Organization, 2020).
- Rotaviruses are the most common cause of severe diarrhoeal disease in young children throughout the world. Global immunization coverage was estimated at 39% (World Health Organization, 2020).
- The world's biggest killer is ischemic heart disease, responsible for 16% of the world's total deaths (World Health Organization, 2020).
- COVID-19 is the leading cause of death in Brazil, England, France, and Mexico and the second-leading cause in the U.S. (Troeger, 2021).
- Tobacco kills more than 8 million people each year (World Health Organization, 2020).

POSITION STATEMENT

Global Health is important in maintaining the safety of individuals worldwide, Nurses not only work in various environments, but continuously address many health issues that universally impact Global Health in positive way.
