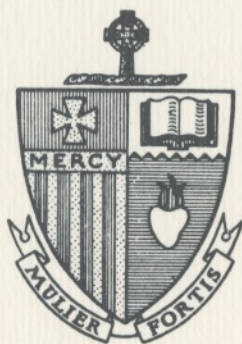

THE HONORABLE MAX ROSENN, J.D. DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, *HONORIS CAUSA*

The Honorable Max Rosenn, Judge of the United States Court of Appeals, has presented to the civic community of Wyoming Valley a model for a career of public service. If the college creates a commonwealth in which learning daily takes place, then the commonwealth must daily apply that learning upheld by the colleges. Judge Rosenn's background and experience demonstrate that he has understood and worked out in his professional, religious, and societal commitments a model for applying academic concepts to daily situations in human and very humane terms.

Max Rosenn received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Cornell University and his Bachelor of Laws from the University of Pennsylvania. Almost immediately his career of public service to his chosen profession of law began. Concurrent with that career were his leadership role in the local and national Jewish community and his role of civic support of local businesses and educational enterprises.

Lawyer and leader, he became special counsel to the Pennsylvania Department of Justice, assistant district attorney in Luzerne County, and partner in the law firm of Rosenn, Jenkins and Greenwald. His public service continued as Secretary to the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare, Chairman of the Governor's Hospital Study Commission, the Governor's Council for Human Services; Chairman of the Commission on Metropolitan Government; Chairman of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Committee; member of the Pennsylvania Commission to Revise Public Employee Laws.

Judge Rosenn's private convictions concerning leadership became evident within the context of his concern that he might help others, in the words of the Old Testament, "to live justly." He has served on the Board of Directors of two local banks, one college, and the Jewish Community Center; he has worked with the Pennsylvania Committee on Children and Youth; he has been President of the Wyoming Valley Jewish Committee and national commander of the Anti-Defamation League.

Judge Rosenn served the United States Army in World War II. He is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers and the International Academy of Trial Lawyers. He was appointed in 1970 to his present position as judge of the United States Court of Appeals.

By conferring on the Honorable Max Rosenn the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, College Misericordia celebrates a significant life in our community. Colleges must create conditions for helping a life acquire significant values; colleges also must recognize those values as the person who lives them translates them into just action. Judge Max Rosenn has influenced our understanding of the relationship of the standards of academic to lived concepts of justice in local, state, and federal government service.

His career is a model of concern for justice as applied to contemporary society; his commitment to leadership is a model for the educated human person concerned about translating values into action that significantly affects the whole network of societal structures.

MARGARET A. FARLEY, R.S.M., Ph.D.
DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, 'HONORIS CAUSA

Margaret A. Farley, R.S.M., associate professor of ethics, Yale Divinity School, New Haven, Connecticut, has been chosen to receive an honorary degree from College Misericordia because of her achievements as a scholar and as a religious woman.

A native of Minnesota, she became a member of the Religious Sisters of Mercy in Detroit, Michigan, in 1959. Her undergraduate studies in literature and later graduate studies in philosophy at the University of Detroit earned her first a Bachelor of Arts and then a Master of Arts degree. Her pursuit of religious studies at Yale earned her a Master of Philosophy and a Doctor of Philosophy degree in the field of ethics. She is the recipient of fellowships and teaching grants both in this country and at British universities.

Throughout her entire professional life, Margaret Farley's main area of scholarly concern has been the study of ethics in our time and in our contemporary environment. In particular she has devoted her intellectual energies to a deeper understanding of religious ethics. From a history of theological ethics to an examination of the ethics of commitment her depth of thought is traced and developed in numerous articles and monographs she has authored. A member of the Editorial Board of *Theological Studies*, a consultant on *Ethical Perspectives*, a research scholar concentrating on the *Phenomenology of Free Choice*, Margaret Farley is the first woman, the first Catholic, the first nun, to be offered the academic position she now holds at Yale Divinity School.

Concern about the nature of commitment has led her to study intensively the causes to which women commit themselves beyond the sociological intent of consciousness-raising about women's issues. Just such concern has led her to write and to lecture in the public arena about commitment, especially as it pertains to the Church, to religious life, to the changing role of women, to academic specializations that touch on each of these in contemporary society. Her research has led to important pronouncements about the dynamic identity of commitment and its effect on integrity and the law.

One among a handful of established women theologians in this country, Margaret Farley stands out with distinction in a territory few have explored. An ethicist, a Religious Sister of Mercy, an author, editor, lecturer, she moves easily from active participation in the little-known world of religious life to creative leadership in the highly visible world of an Ivy League School of Divinity. She addresses with ease the Ethics of Commitment within the context of theories of human love and human time, whether in a small seminar or before the entire Leadership Conference of Women Religious. Several years of thinking out and living out what commitment means places Margaret Farley in the foreground of today's highly original thinkers because her thoughts are vibrantly servicing the Catholic Church, religious life, higher education, and the developments of the human spirit.

Margaret Farley, R.S.M., exemplifies the motto of College Misericordia, "Mulier Fortis." She is a valiant woman.
