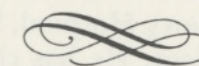

ROBERT PATRICK CASEY DOCTOR OF LAWS, *HONORIS CAUSA*

Robert Patrick Casey has been chosen to receive an honorary degree from College Misericordia in recognition of his life-long commitment to the promotion of justice in public service — service to the people of Pennsylvania and to the Commonwealth.

A native of New York, Mr. Casey has lived most of his life in Pennsylvania. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree at Holy Cross College and his law degree at George Washington University Law School. He credits both his father's teachings and his early Jesuit schooling with its strong service-oriented training for his own personal and professional efforts to promote justice and to help others achieve quality of life.

A scholarship student all through his years of education, Mr. Casey began as a leader in athletics and progressed to elected leadership positions in each of the educational institutions he attended. An editor of the **George Washington Law Review**, he went on to become first an associate in a law firm in Washington, D.C., then, after private practice, to become a partner in the Philadelphia law firm of Dilworth, Paxson, Kalish and Kaufman in Scranton.

From the beginning of his public career, his personal and professional leadership qualities have brought him again and again to elected office, from co-chairman of the Democratic Platform Committee to State Senator to Vice-President of the Pennsylvania State Constitutional Convention. From 1969 to 1977, Attorney Casey served as Auditor General of Pennsylvania where his concern for justice emerged as a concern for the people of Pennsylvania. His tenure in that office became legend as he turned it from a perfunctory job to an actively professional service in support of justice.

Concern for the quality of civic life brought Attorney Casey to positions of volunteer service in the civic community. He has served on the Board of Directors of Mercy Hospital, Scranton, and the Board of Trustees of Marywood College. He has chaired fund drives for the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, the Regional Red Cross Blood Center, and the Junior Achievement Association of Northeastern Pennsylvania, and has chaired the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults in Pennsylvania.

Honors and awards bestowed upon him include two honorary doctoral degrees, one from St. Francis College, one from the University of Scranton; his hard work, determination, and ability have earned him awards for outstanding leadership, distinguished service, and high achievement.

The intensity of dedication which led him from attorney to senator to auditor general has now brought him to the highest elected position in the state he has so successfully served. Robert Patrick Casey was inaugurated January 20, 1987, as Governor of Pennsylvania. It is the intensity of his dedication to public service, the depth of his commitment to justice, the ardor of his concern for quality of life which College Misericordia acknowledges today. Robert Patrick Casey is a man with a sense of mission, one that reflects the very mission of this College: concern for justice and concern for people.



JAY J. DUGAN DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS *HONORIS CAUSA*

College Misericordia is pleased to honor Philadelphia sculptor and business executive Jay J. Dugan for his achievements as a distinguished artist and humanitarian. Nationally and internationally, the art world is recognizing Mr. Dugan's unique abstract stone sculptures currently seen throughout American universities, colleges, commercial buildings and private collections. College Misericordia is fortunate to be the new home of one of these major works entitled "Emerging."

The striking eleven-foot, twenty-six ton massive sculpture that now graces the north campus depicts the emergence of a college student from the rough-cast partially discernible figure of a beginner to the smooth, clearly purposeful figure of a finished academic. The sculpture forcefully attests to the artist's understanding of intellectual development, of growth process, and of achievement. The time-released figures now stand as a permanent monument to Jay Dugan's artistry and to his generosity in designating Misericordia as the perfect setting for his impressive artistic donation.

Evidence that Mr. Dugan understands intellectual development, growth process, and achievement shows in his own career. Born and raised in a poor family in Philadelphia's Germantown section, he labored several years before his exceptional determination and talent led him to start his own advertising agency. Without ever fulfilling his dream of obtaining a college education, Mr. Dugan went on to realize the classic entrepreneurial career.

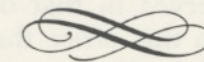
Although success in business led to financial independence, it was Mr. Dugan's second career twelve years ago as a sculptor that brought fulfillment to the artist. He studied at the Barnes Foundation, the Philadelphia College of Art, the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and also with Bucks County sculptor Robert L. Montgomery.

Love of the fine arts has led the artist we honor today to establish studios in Meadowbrook, Pennsylvania, and in Torano, Italy. Love of sculpture has led him to create from Italian marble statues that speak to American college students. His work graces several college and university campuses including Villanova, LaSalle, Lehigh, Rosemont, and Allentown College. In a characteristic humanitarian gesture, he brings to many campuses art works they could scarcely afford to buy.

His vision of intellectual development is that it is "Emerging" from barely defined ideas to sharp, incisive concepts; his vision of the process of growth is that it too is "Emerging" from the uncertainty of

beginnings to the clear definitiveness of disciplined ends; his vision of achievement is that it is "Emerging" from early aspiration to specific, informed goals and objectives. It is no surprise that his artistic works evoke immediate and warm emotional and aesthetic response. Mr. Dugan's contemporary, clean-lined sculpture, "Emerging" reflects his personal unabashed optimism and his joy in life.

Today College Misericordia acknowledges Jay J. Dugan whose personal and professional philosophy of life brings artistic and humanistic achievement to this campus.



SISTER M. ELOISE MCGINTY, R.S.M.

When Catherine Patrice McGinty finished St. Mary's High School in Wilkes-Barre, she chose to live the life of a Religious Sister of Mercy. Their concern for the poor, for the sick, for those who needed education became her concerns too. Inspired by the Religious Sisters of Mercy, founded in Dublin, Ireland one hundred years earlier, Catherine McGinty took upon herself a way of life that could benefit the needy of this world, particularly the needy of Wyoming Valley.

Catherine McGinty from the small town of Sugar Notch, Pennsylvania became Sister M. Eloise in the small town of Dallas, Pennsylvania. The physical dimensions of her world became the hundred acres on which the Sisters of Mercy had built College Misericordia in 1924. It is now fifty years since Sister Eloise began her life of commitment to education on this campus. Small as the physical dimensions of the campus world are, the dimensions of one woman's influence on that world during those fifty years are truly incalculable.

Sister Eloise's natural ability for organization and attention to detail led her to earn a Bachelor's degree in Business Education at College Misericordia in 1940. A few years later, she earned a Master's degree in Education from Fordham University. Both degrees prepared her for her life's work here as, first, a professor in the Business department, and later as chair of that department where she organized the curriculum and directed faculty members. In her early years on campus, in addition to teaching duties, Sister Eloise served as secretary to four successive academic deans. Always a sports enthusiast, she was moderator of the College athletic program through twenty-five of its early years.

In 1967, she became registrar of the College, succeeding Sister Rosaire Hanlon who had served in that office for 42 years of the College's existence. It was in this office that Sister Eloise's greatest sphere of influence asserted itself. Many alumni remember her as teacher, dorm counselor, organizer of support for athletic events; but today, all alumni recognize Sister Eloise not only because she kept their official records in meticulous order, but also because in her role as special assistant to the president, Sister Eloise has now become a primary fund-raiser among alumni during the Annual Phon-a-thon.

As a member of this campus community for half of a century, Sister Eloise has lived her Mercy mission among administrators, staff, faculty, and students. They were the needy of her world; to them, and to the various other publics she served, she taught, by example, order and precision and attention to detail. From one small office on one small campus, Sister Eloise McGinty has exemplified the values of the followers of Catherine McAuley, especially the justice of an ordered existence.

The Catherine McAuley Medal awarded for "compassionate service" is hereby awarded to Sister M. Eloise McGinty for her fifty years of dedication and commitment to the ideals of the Sisters of Mercy and this College.
