#### RAYMOND C. KURZWEIL DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, HONORIS CAUSA

College Misericordia is especially proud to confer an honorary degree on Raymond Kurzweil in recognition of his extraordinary achievements in the area of artificial intelligence technology over the past twenty years. It is particularly fitting that this college acknowledge this contemporary scientist whose inventions have enabled Misericordia to educate here students who might not otherwise have been admitted to academic life. Kurzweil's application of computer technology to the needs of the handicapped has catapulted his human compassion and concern for others into the probability of compact devices for mobility training in the twenty-first century.

A native of Queens, New York, Kurzweil knew at the age of 6 that, much as he loved music, he was at heart a scientist. By the age of 12 he had not only met and mastered his first "computer," his life pattern was set, as he began writing computer programs later distributed by IBM. In high school he combined his love for music with his talent for technical innovation and won the Westinghouse Science Talent Search for programming a computer to compose music in the style of Mozart, Chopin, and Beethoven. During his education at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he developed a program that matched student aptitudes with college requirements. His early competence with machines and their possible functions matched his concern with people and their possible futures.

Graduation from MIT in 1970 found Kurzweil, equipped with a degree in computer science and literature, combining technology with liberal arts which led to his invention of an omni-font optical character recognition technology (ORT), and a reading machine which translated printed text into words verbalized aloud in a synthesized voice. The Kurzweil Reading Machine was the beginning of a series of inventions enabling those without vision to see, literally, the vision described in his new book, The Age of Intelligent Machines. Subsequent inventions include the Kurzweil Data Entry Machine for corporate and government data-base building, and the new voiceworks or VAT, a real-life voice-activated typewriter, with an estimated 20,000 word vocabulary. He is most often recognized for his 1983 invention of the Kurzweil 250, a digital keyboard synthesizer created for musician Stevie Wonder.

Raymond C. Kurzweil is founder and president of three companies that bear his name: in 1974, Kurzweil Computer Products, Inc.; in 1982, Kurzweil Applied Intelligence, Inc.; also in 1982, Kurzweil Music Systems. He is currently chairman of the KRM Division of Xerox, and the Kurzweil Foundation, which provides support technology for the handicapped and forums to advance public understanding of the social impact of new technology. His list of honors and awards spans more than ten years of a truly distinguished career from the Grace Murray Hopper Award in 1978 to "Best of the New Generation Award" in 1984 to the Inventor of the Year Award from MIT in 1988, plus six film awards. He holds four Honorary Doctorates to which College Misericordia is proud to add one more, Doctor of Humane Letters.

Central to the technical expression of Raymond Kurzweil's inventive genius is his never-wavering concern for the needs of handicapped persons. Because to him they are real persons with real needs, he responds inventively with machines the handicapped can really use, always respecting their own individuality and intelligence. Kurzweil envisions an **Age of Intelligent Machines**; on this campus and around the world, his machines offer a new age of applied intelligence to all users. College Misericordia acknowledges today the human compassion with which Raymond Kurzweil uses his own real intellectual gifts.

#### SISTER WILLIAM JOSEPH LYDON, R.S.M. DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, HONORIS CAUSA

College Misericordia has chosen to honor Sister William Joseph Lydon, RSM, for her consistent dedication to the works of mercy and her local as well as national leadership in the field of health care. Twice serving as Administrator and President of Mercy Hospital, Scranton, she has, over a 27-year period, emerged also as a leader among the Sisters of Mercy Scranton Province and in the Catholic Hospital Association of St. Louis.

A native of Northeastern Pennsylvania, Sister William Joseph entered the Religious Sisters of Mercy in Dallas, Pennsylvania, in 1945. After graduating from College Misericordia, she pursued graduate studies in hospital administration at St. Louis University in Missouri. From there, as one of the youngest hospital administrators in the country, she began service at Mercy Hospital in Scranton, then a 90-bed facility. Today that same hospital, as a result of a \$47 million expansion, is an accredited 372-bed health care unit. The mission of Mercy — the care of the sick — and the ministry of leadership in hospital management began early to shape the life to which Sister William Joseph demonstrated deep dedication.

From 1963 to 1970 Sister William Joseph served in another managerial capacity: she became the Provincial Administrator of the Religious Sisters of Mercy of the Scranton Province. Her jurisdiction extended through Pennsylvania, New York, and Guyana, South America, and included responsibility for 900 Sisters who staffed two colleges, 17 high schools, 63 elementary schools, and four hospitals. During these years she was one of ten administrators selected to study the future role of Catholic hospitals as a subsystem in American health care. As President of the Catholic Hospital Association with headquarters in St. Louis, Sister William Joseph functioned on an advisory committee to the U.S. Catholic Bishops and on the faculty of St. Louis University Health Leadership Conferences.

A Fellow of the American College of Health Executives, Sister was elected to Boards of Directors in Scranton, Dallas, Harrisburg, New York, and Savannah, Georgia. A member of the Greater Scranton Chamber of Commerce and of Leadership Lackawanna, she also received an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Scranton.

Leadership always requires change, change inspires innovation, innovation today demands the newest in technology, and Sister William Joseph, at Mercy Hospital in Scranton has brought innovative technology to the hospital in the treatment of cancer and in the cardiac diagnostic treatment and surgery for which Mercy Scranton is widely known. As a Sister of Mercy dedicated to "the care of the poor and the sick," Sister William Joseph daily directs a work dear to the heart of Catherine McAuley, the first Sister of Mercy to engage in the work of healing and caring. For all these endeavors, especially for outstanding evidence of remarkable leadership, College Misericordia today confers on Sister William Joseph Lydon her second degree from this institution, this time the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters.
