THE HONORABLE JOHN HUME, MP, MEP, AND PATRICIA HUME

Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa

Today College Misericordia is greatly honored and pleased to welcome the Honorable John Hume, MP, MEP, and his wife, Patricia Hume, as this year's Commencement speaker and honorary degree recipients. Over the past 30 years, the Humes have been powerful advocates for peace and partnership in Northern Ireland, working tirelessly to bring about an end to the national, religious and social strife which has taken the lives of more than 3,500 people, both Catholic and Protestant.

Mr. Hume is considered one of the primary architects of the ongoing peace process in his country; it was his willingness to negotiate with leaders of the Protestant majority that enabled both sides to bring forth the historic 1998 Good Friday Agreement.

In recognition of Mr. Hume's dedication to peace and his unceasing efforts to find an equitable solution to the conflict in Northern Ireland, the Norwegian Nobel Committee awarded the 1998 Nobel Peace Prize to him and to David Trimble, the leader of the Northern Ireland government. In awarding the prize, the Committee noted that "Mr. Hume has throughout been the clearest and most consistent of Northern Ireland's political leaders in his work for a peaceful solution. The foundations of the peace agreement signed on Good Friday 1998 reflect principles which he has stood for."

Mr. Hume, a member of the British and Northern Ireland Parliaments and the leader of the Social Democratic and Labor Party (SDLP), has been devoted to the principles of peace and understanding since 1968, when he emerged as a leader of the non-violent Civil Rights Movement in Derry. In 1970 he was elected as a representative for the Foyle Constituency to Parliament; later that year he and five other members of Parliament formed a new party, the SDLP, and he has served as its leader since 1979.

In this position he has led his party in a series of negotiations all designed to bring about an end to the conflict in his country. He also took the courageous step of meeting with Gerry Adams, leader of Sinn Fein, in an effort to end the violence. These talks, and other negotiations, led to the signing of the Good Friday agreement.

Mr. Hume's leadership is not limited to Northern Ireland. He also is a member of the European Parliament, where he is an influential member of the Socialist Group, the Parliament's largest party. He has served on the Committee for Regional Planning and Policy since 1979, and also served as special advisor to the European Community Commissioner Richard Burke.

A great admirer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., Mr. Hume has his own dream for Ireland: a country that respects diversity and difference, a country with a future that all can rejoice in, a country where a badge of honor is not a source of fear or division. He wants to see Ireland, both North and South, with its wounds healed, play its rightful role in Europe. He wants to see Ireland as an example to men and women everywhere of what can be achieved by living for ideals rather than fighting for them.

Mr. Hume is not alone in his crusade for peace in Ireland. Patricia Hume, his wife, has been an advocate of justice and human rights in Derry and beyond for the last 30 years. As director and administrator of the MP and MEP's office in Derry/Londonderry, she has supported her husband's efforts on the national scene while serving his Foyle constituents, both Catholic and Protestant, with compassion, commitment, and vision.

Educated by the Sisters of Mercy at Thornhill College, Derry, Mrs. Hume has served as a respected teacher and administrator, and is known as a devoted nonviolent worker for

peace, human and civil rights for the Catholic community in Northern Ireland. In addition to her ongoing work on behalf of her country and her community, Mrs. Hume and her husband have raised three daughters and two sons.

Those who recognize the lasting value of this couple's dedication to peace have honored them with many awards, such as the 1998 Nobel Peace Prize, the 1999 Martin Luther King Award, the 1999 Legion d'Honneur, the 1998 Global Citizens Award, the 1994 International League for Human Rights Award, the 1996 International Human Rights Award, and many others. They also have received honorary degrees from several American, Irish and French universities.

In the ongoing struggle to bring peace to Northern Ireland, John and Patricia Hume stand as exemplary proponents of the principles of justice, integrity, political and moral courage and understanding. In recognition of their commitment to their country and to peace, College Misericordia is honored to bestow upon the Honorable John Hume, MP, MEP, and Patricia Hume the Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa.

Catherine McAuley Medal

College Misericordia is very pleased today to present the prestigious Catherine McAuley Medal to a devoted alumna, talented teacher and skilled administrator who, during her 40 year tenure on the faculty, prepared many students for satisfying careers in nutrition, home economics, nursing, merchandising and education. Joan Krause, who retired from teaching in December, 1999, will be remembered for her deep interest in her students and for her dedication to the nutrition profession.

The first of her family to go to college, Ms. Krause enrolled at Misericordia in 1954 and graduated as valedictorian of her class, receiving a bachelor's degree in home economics. She returned to the College one year later as an assistant professor in the home economics education department, teaching some young women who had been in class with her only a short time before. She began master's level studies, eventually earning master's degrees in education from the University of Scranton and a second master's in nutrition from Marywood College.

In 1962 she earned a certificate in merchandising from Drexel University and began Misericordia's merchandising program. Two years later she moved into the nutrition program, eventually serving as chair of that program and later the Allied Health division. Most recently Ms. Krause has served on the faculty of the teacher education department and directed the student teacher program.

A registered dietitian, she has her own private practice as a nutrition consultant, has worked as a nutritionist for the Davis Nursing Home and for Geisinger Medical Center in Danville, and has won the Anita Owen Award, a prestigious award from the

Pennsylvania Dietetic Association, for her service to the profession in the community and in education. She also has been named to three honor societies: Kappa Gamma Pi, Sigma Phi Sigma and Kappa Delta Pi.

In addition to her teaching, Ms. Krause has been active in community organizations such as the American Cancer Society, Northeast Pennsylvania Counseling Services, Hospice St. John, the Northeast Pennsylvania Dietetic Association, the Northeast Pennsylvania Nutrition Council and many others. She also is a member of the American Dietetic Association, the American Home Economics Association, and other professional organizations and has served on a variety of advisory boards dealing with nutrition.

Upon her retirement last year, the Misericordia Board of Trustees recognized her significant and sustained contributions to the College and its students by naming her professor emeritus, an honor few other faculty members have received.

The McAuley Medal is not awarded annually, but on the basis of merit. This is the tenth medal to be presented in the last fifteen years.

Since 1959 Joan Krause has demonstrated the qualities of a master teacher: love of her subject, expertise, respect and concern for her students, integrity, and the never-ending desire to learn and advance in her profession. In gratitude for her 40 years of service, and in recognition of her significant and continuing devotion to the College and to the mission of Mercy, College Misericordia is pleased to present Joan L. Krause '58 with the Catherine McAuley Medal.

THE MACE



The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the College campus and referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base, angled yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy, Dallas Regional Community, liberal arts education and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit which is the basis of Compassionate Service while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the College: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the College from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, open to new ideas, is symbolic of the light of learning, always striving for, never reaching the fullness of finish.

The College Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, gold and silversmith. It is the gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.
