Camille D'Arienzo, RSM, PhD

Sister Camille D'Arienzo was the first of two daughters born to Rafaella Acierno and Louis D'Arienzo, who were born in Italy and met and married in New York. Baptized Joan Louise, she grew up in Queens, New York. She was eight and her sister, Gloria, was three when their mother died and they were sent as boarders to Our Lady of Mercy Academy in Syosset, Long Island.

A year after graduation, Camille entered the Sisters of Mercy. She received a Bachelor's in Education from Fordham University in 1964, and a Master's in 1968 and Doctorate in 1974 from the University of Michigan.

From her earliest years she exhibited a passion for people who were neglected and a detestation of war and violence as solutions to human problems. Since the 1970s she has advocated for victims of oppression in society and in the Church. She traveled to El Salvador and Nicaragua in the 1980s after the murders of the U.S. Churchwomen. She has demonstrated against the arms race, the training of terrorists in the School of the Americas, and has gathered a Cherish Life Circle to support an end to capital punishment.

Since 1973 D'Arienzo has broadcast weekly commentaries on 1010 WINS, an all-news New York radio station. She is a journalist and popular public speaker, and the recipient of numerous awards.

D'Arienzo served two years as president of the Brooklyn Regional Community of the Sisters of Mercy and three years as president of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious.

On September 8, 2001, she marked 50 years as a Sisters of Mercy and is at a midpoint in celebrating her jubilee year.

Most Reverend James C. Timlin, DD


James C. Timlin was born on August 5, 1927 in Scranton, the son of the late James C. and Helen Norton Timlin. After schooling in North Scranton and attending college and seminary in Maryland, he enrolled in the North American College in Rome, Italy, where he completed his studies for the priesthood. He was ordained on July 16, 1951.

Timlin was appointed Assistant Pastor at Saint John the Evangelist Parish, Pittston in 1952 and at Saint Peter's Cathedral Parish, Scranton in 1966. After serving as Assistant Chancellor of the Diocese and Secretary to the Most Reverend J. Carroll McCormick, DD, Sixth Bishop of Scranton, he was appointed Chaplain to His Holiness, Pope Paul VI in 1967. He became Chancellor of the Diocese in 1971 and was designated a Prelate of Honor of His Holiness in 1972. He was named Auxiliary Bishop of Scranton and Vicar General of the Diocese of Scranton in 1976, and Pastor of the Church of the Nativity of Our Lord, Scranton in 1979. Timlin was appointed Eighth Bishop of Scranton by His Holiness, Pope John Paul II in 1984.

His work includes positions of honor with the Diocesan Liturgical Commission, the Priests Education Committee, St. Pius X Seminary, the Diocesan Board of Consultors, the National Association of Holy Name Societies, The Catholic Light, and the Preparatory Commission for the Diocesan Synod. He has served on the NCCB Administrative Board, the National Advisory Council, and the Board of the North American College, as well as consulted on the Liturgy Committee.

Bishop Timlin is currently a consultant to the Ecumenical Committee and the Migration Committee, and is the Episcopal Moderator of the National Association of Catholic Airport Chaplains.

Rt. Hon. W. David Trimble, MP MLA

David Trimble was born in Bangor, Ireland on October 15, 1944. He was educated at Bangor Grammar School, graduated from Queen's University LL.B (1st class) in 1968, and became a Barrister at Law in 1969. He edited the *Northern Ireland Law Reports* from 1974 to 1990 and has contributed to several legal publications. In 1978 he married Daphne Elizabeth Orr; they have four children: Richard, Victoria, Nicholas, and Sarah.

Trimble entered politics in 1975 when he was elected to the Northern Ireland Constitutional Convention as representative of the Vanguard Unionist Party, part of a United Unionist coalition with the mainstream Ulster Unionist Party (UUP) and the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP). The Convention was established by the British Government following the collapse of the Sunningdale Agreement. During inter-party talks in the Convention, Trimble backed the idea of Vanguard leader Bill Craig for a coalition between Unionists and the Social Democratic and Labour Party to launch a new devolved Parliament for Northern Ireland. The idea was not backed by the rest of the United Unionist Coalition and Craig and Trimble were expelled. Trimble then joined the Ulster Unionist Party. In 1983 he became Vice-Chair and in 1985 Chair of Lagan Valley Unionist Association. From 1990 through 1996 he was Honorary Secretary of the Ulster Unionist Council and from 1989 to 1995 Chair of the UUP Legal Committee.

During this period Trimble was active with the Queen's University Unionist Association. He was responsible for a number of publications, one of which, *Ulster, The Internal Colony,* was adopted by the UUP as the basis for a campaign for fair treatment of Northern Ireland business within the United Kingdom Parliament. This campaign resulted in the creation of the Northern Ireland Select Committee and the Northern Ireland Grand Committee.

In 1985 Trimble was founding Chair of the Ulster Society for the Promotion of Ulster British Culture and Heritage, a non-partisan and inclusive organization. The Society published a regular magazine and produced a score of publications, two of which Trimble authored. He resigned as Chair in 1990 when he was elected MP for Upper Bann Constituency. In 1995 Trimble was elected Leader of the Ulster Unionist Party and immediately began a series of talks with other parties, becoming the first Unionist Leader to meet the Irish Government in Government Building in Dublin. He persuaded the British Government that any inter-party talks involving parties linked to terrorist groups should be initiated through an elected body. This led to the election of the Northern Ireland Forum for Political Dialogue in May 1996, from whose members the participants in the Northern Ireland inter-party talks were drawn. These talks culminated in the Belfast Agreement in April, 1998.

In June 1998 Trimble was elected an Assembly member for Upper Bann and in July of 1998 was elected First Minister (Designate). Power was devolved to the Northern Ireland Assembly in December of 1999. In June of 2001 the Ulster Unionist Party gained over 27percent of the vote, giving the UUP one third of Northern Ireland's seats in the Westminster Parliament and making it Northern Ireland's largest political party. Trimble resigned from Office on June 30, 2001 because of the failure of Republicans to decommission. Following the start of IRA decommissioning in October of 2001, he was re-elected as First Minister on November 6, 2001.

In December 1998 Trimble received the Nobel Peace Prize with John Hume for work in securing the Belfast Agreement; in 1999 he was awarded the Légion d'honneur by French President Jacques Chirac. He became a member of Her Majesty's Privy Council in 1996.

His interests are music, opera, history and reading.


The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy Dallas Regional Community, liberal arts education, and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the College: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the College from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The College Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.

History White American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly Oxford which was founded in the 12th century. The academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations of the time, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest that it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements

and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, College Misericordia's hood is lined with blue and gold. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving College honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.
