# Brooke M. Ellison, MPP

While on her way home from her first day of seventh grade, Brooke Mackenzie Ellison was struck by a car. The accident left her paralyzed and ventilator-dependent. With the help of her family and the dedication of her mother, Jean, Ellison completed rehabilitation and went on to graduate from her local high school.

Ellison scored 1510 on her College Board entrance exam and was accepted to Harvard University where she graduated summa cum laude in 2000. Her thesis, "Does Hope Float? The Study of Presence of Hope in Resilience," was written with the aid of a voice-activated computer. Ellison received her Master's degree in Public Policy in 2001 from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government. She is presently enrolled in the political psychology doctoral program at Stony Brook University.

Ellison credits her father, Ed, with making "significant, almost unimaginable sacrifices" to ensure that her life would be as productive as possible. Jean Ellison was constantly at her daughter's side: as caretaker, notetaker, and advocate throughout her education. When Ellison graduated from Harvard, Jean was awarded a mock degree in "virtual studies" from her daughter's housemates.

In 2002, with Jean, she wrote *Miracles Happen: One Mother, One Daughter, One Journey*, the story of the family's experiences from the day of Ellison's accident until her graduation from Harvard. Christopher Reeves directed the movie of her book; *The Brooke Ellison Story* aired on A&E in 2004.

A popular motivational speaker, Ellison talks to politicians, business leaders, members of the medical community and, especially, with children and teenagers. She has made several television and radio appearances. She is currently an advocate for funding of medical research. Ellison is a member of the board of directors of the National Organization on Disablilities.

# Andrew J. Sordoni, III

Andrew J. Sordoni, III has been a community and business leader and supporter of the arts in our region for almost four decades.

He attended Notre Dame University and received a bachelor's degree from King's College in Wilkes-Barre. The former Chairman and President of C-Tec Corporation, he was involved in the planning and management of the first commercial fiber optic telephone connection in the United States as well as the company's development into a diversified telecommunications organization. He is currently Chairman of Sordoni Construction Services, Inc.

Sordoni has held key positions with local, state, and national organizations, and has served on boards of many, including Pennsylvania Gas & Water Company and the Harsco Corporation. A supporter of area institutions including the United Way, Sordoni has encouraged local philanthropic support for civic, cultural, educational, and humanitarian causes, both as Chairman of the Sordoni Foundation and as a volunteer. He was a founding member of the Flood Recovery Task Force, organized in 1972 to rebuild the area after the devastating Agnes flood.

An enthusiastic collector of American Illustration and Comic Art, he has curated and supported exhibitions at regional and national galleries and museums. A devotee of America's classic music, jazz, he has organized concerts and produces recordings for his own company, Chiaroscuro Records. Sordoni was a major sponsor of College Misericordia's *Jazz in July* series, which began in 2000.

He is a recipient of numerous honors, including the Ben Franklin Award for Distinguished Leadership in the Commonwealth given by the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry; and awards from the Wyoming Valley Interfaith Council and B'nai B'rith. Sordoni lives at Harveys Lake with his wife, CM alumna Susan Fort Sordoni, MD '68.

# Patrick J. Solano

Patrick J. Solano has had a long and distinguished career in public service in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

A graduate of Pittston High School and of the United States Air Force School of Engineering at Amarillo Air Force Base, Texas, Solano served during World War II with the Eighth US Air Force Heavy Bombardment Group and completed 34 combat missions. He was awarded the Group Presidential Citation, the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, and the European Combat Theatrical Medal with two Bronze Stars for his service.

Solano's career in public administration began in the Department of Highways as principal assistant superintendent. He has served as deputy secretary for several state agencies, including the Department of Environmental Resources, Department of General Services, and the General State Authority. He was acting secretary of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. Solano was named Senior Counselor to Governors Tom Ridge and Mark Schweitzer and is presently a Special Advisor to the Majority Leader of the Pennsylvania State Senate.

A member of boards of many organizations in the area, including the FM Kirby Center for the Performing Arts and Hospice of the Sacred Heart, Solano has also been a trustee of several educational institutions in the area. He has been a fund raiser for many worthy causes. Most recently he secured a grant from the Blue Ribbon Foundation in support of nursing education in northeastern Pennsylvania.

He is the recipient of numerous awards, including the The Pennsylvania Recreation and Park Society Governmental Award in recognition of his work in promoting conservation and recreation.

Solano and his wife, Marie, have six daughters.

American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements

and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, College Misericordia's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving College honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.

The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the College campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy Dallas Regional Community, liberal arts education, and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the College: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the College from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The College Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.

College Misericordia is sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy Dallas Regional Community, a member institution of the Institute of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas.

The flags on the Commencement stage today represent countries where Sisters and Associates from the Dallas Regional Community, faculty, staff, and students have ministered. Also included are the flags of foreign students and graduates.
