Class of 2006

The Class of 2006 at College Misericordia is its 80th and largest graduating class, with 504 graduates from 12 states, including the College's first two graduates from Nigeria, Sisters Ogechukwu Aboh and Chioma Ahanihu.

About 400 of the graduates received a professional internship placement in their majors, which amounts to about 40,000 hours of in-the-field training in business, nursing, occupational therapy, medical imaging, communications, chemistry, biology, speech-language pathology, and social work.

There are other impressive statistics compiled by students in our 30 majors. For instance, physical therapy students graduating from the master's degree program participated in a total of 16,156 hours of laboratory classes; 17,444 hours of lecture classes; and 29,120 hours of clinical education in their junior, senior, and graduate years. Teacher education's 55 graduates were placed in high school and elementary school classrooms during 2005-2006, performing a combined 825 weeks of teaching.

Fred J. Epstein, MD

Fred J. Epstein, MD

When 4-year-old Vijai Naraine was no longer able to walk or feed himself, his family became desperate. The boy was in a rehabilitation facility in Georgetown, Guyana when he met Lauren Gianocopolis, a CM occupational therapy student volunteering as part of a six-week summer course. Realizing that Vijai had serious neurological challenges, Lauren sought help from Brenda Hage, CM assistant professor of nursing who was also on the trip teaching medical staff. Hage determined the boy had fluid in his brain caused by a large brain tumor and was in desperate need of neuro-surgical intervention not available in Guyana.

Enter Dr. Fred J. Epstein. Having received Epstein's name from a friend who described the man as "pediatric neurosurgeon dedicated to helping children from all walks of life," Hage called Epstein's office at Beth Israel Hospital in New York City. After just a 15-minute conversation with Tanya Maher Evans, a nurse practitioner in Epstein's practice, Hage was told to get Vijai to Beth Israel and that Epstein would donate his neurosurgical services. Amazed at how quickly Epstein's services were offered, Brenda questioned whether Evans needed to verify her proposal with the doctor. Without hesitation, Evans replied, "No need—this is what we do."

Vijai's story is just one in a long list of philanthropic services by Dr. Fred Epstein. Born in Yonkers, New York, the middle son of an intellectually gifted family, young Fred's struggles with learning issues challenged both him and his parents. But it was a factor that formed his character: his drive, his work ethic, and his empathy for children. Epstein received his medical degree from New York Medical College in 1963 and performed his surgical internship and surgical residency at Montefiore Medical Center in New York City. In 1970, he completed a neurosurgical residency at New York University Medical Center while serving in the United States Army Reserve. He was appointed professor of neurosurgery at NYU Medical Center and in 1985 became the first director of the Division of Pediatric Neurosurgery.

Epstein has served as president of the International Society of Pediatric Neurosurgery, the American Society of Pediatric Neurosurgeryn and the Pediatric Section of the American Association of Neurological Surgeons; and editor-in-chief of the Journal of Pediatric Neurosurgery. He has received fellowships from the American College of Surgeons, the New York Academy of Medicine, and the American Academy of Pediatrics. In 2004, he received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Pediatric Section of the American Association of Neurological Surgeons.

Following a personal imperative to provide patients with both comfort and state-of-the-art technology, Epstein was intimately involved in the creation of the Institute of Neurology and Neurosurgery at Beth Israel Medical Center. It is there that he was able to fulfill his dream of a technologically advanced facility where the special needs of his young patients and their families dealing with the most serious illnesses could be treated in a unique environment.

But in September 2001, Epstein faced possibly the greatest obstacle of his life. While riding his bike near his Connecticut home, he had an accident that tore a blood vessel in his skull, putting him in a coma for close to a month, leaving his speech slurred, his right side partially paralyzed, and his life forever altered. Although he no longer operates because of his disabilities, Epstein has, as he said, "Instead, embarked on an accidental journey toward an uncertain destination."

As for Vijai? Epstein and his partner, Dr. George Jallo, were able to successfully remove Vijai's tumor and relieve the pressure on his brain. Today, Vijai is a happy, well-adjusted third grader who likes to draw, ride his bike, and play with his brother, Kavin. He and his family live in Queens, New York and are forever grateful to Dr. Epstein for his wonderful and life-saving care.

Epstein's philosophy about caring for children is chronicled in his book, *If I Get to Five: What Children Can Teach Us About Courage and Character.* Epstein lives in Connecticut with his wife, Kathy. They have five children, two sons-in-law, and three granddaughters.

The whole reason to speak is to share my perspectives on the ingredients of success. Hopefully, these will be taken seriously because they are illustrative on how anyone can change the world.

Honorary Degree Recipients



Yankel Ginsburg

Artists are individualistic; each one has his own style. They depend on their inner world; nevertheless, an artist deserves recognition only if he benefits society. If he enriches only himself, it is greed not greatness.

Yankel Ginzberg

Several works of internationally acclaimed contemporary artist Yankel Ginzburg adorn the walls of the Mary Kintz Bevevino Library on the College Misericordia campus, a gift to the college from Mr. & Mrs. Robert Aben, of Unigraphic Printing in Plymouth. Ginzburg's art is a collection of new visionary concepts, incomparable and extraordinary. What is remarkable about Yankel Ginzburg is not just the variety and strength of his work, but the human being who created them. A native of Russia, educated in Israel, and now residing in the United States, Ginzburg has been a prominent force in the contemporary art world for nearly four decades. The youngest student ever admitted to the Academy of Art in Israel, Ginzburg explores and creates in all forms of media, gliding effortlessly through all of them.

While serving in the Israeli military during The Six Day War in 1967, Ginzburg vowed that if he survived that horrific experience he would dedicate himself to peace and seek ways to equalize the injustices of the world. He has flown to Cambodia and other countries to distribute food and medical supplies, but his largest undertaking has been the creation of The Fund for Democracy and Development. Encouraged by Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev and Russian Federation President Boris Yeltsin to establish a non-governmental organization to aid the people of the crumbling Soviet Union, Ginzburg rose to the challenge. The Fund is credited with channeling over 240 million dollars of staples and medical goods to the former Soviet Union.

Ginsburg's paintings are well developed, intense, but never complete. There always seems to be despair, some tragic moment, yet there is also a sense that the world can be pieced back together again and that all will be good. While some of his pieces are for pure pleasure, others provoke intense thought. One of his most exciting public projects is an SS-20 Soviet missile, a symbol of war and destruction transformed into an object of love and peace, subjects to which Ginzburg devotes his life.

Virginia Banks

Virginia "Ginger" Banks has been dedicated to the principles of College Misericordia and its founding sponsors for many years. She and her late husband Joseph provided significant financial support to the renovation of the campus student center which bears the family name.

Banks' lifetime of commitment to the ideals and goals of the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, as well as her longstanding commitment to the regional and College communities, makes her an exceptional choice for the Catherine McAuley Medal. Mrs. Banks received the Sisters of Mercy Woman of the Year Award in 1998 and was recognized by College Misericordia for her considerable support to the improvement of the College by being awarded the Trustee Associates Award in 1999.

Together with Walter Kelly, Banks co-founded Misericordia's popular Theatre-On-The-Green event in 1988. Mrs. Banks is dedicated to the Sisters of Mercy and supports many causes for women in need, including Women with Children. In the spirit of Catherine McAuley, she initiated "Women Indeed," an effort to help incarcerated women adjust to the transition back to society. Her goal is always to provide women with the skills and support needed to make the transition from prison to civilian life.

A native of Massachusetts now residing in Dallas, Banks is the owner of Odyssey Fitness Center and Odyssey Express for Women . She is a member of the Wyoming Seminary Parents Association, King's College Irish Teachers Program and the Huntsville Golf Club.

As director of The Joseph B. and Virginia H. Banks Foundation, Mrs. Banks sponsors numerous fund-raising events for local non-profit organizations, such as the AJump for Heart@ to benefit for the American Heart Association of Wyoming Valley. She has three children and nine grandchildren.

American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements

and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, College Misericordia's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving College honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.



The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the College campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy Dallas Regional Community, liberal arts education, and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit, which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the College: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the College from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The College Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.

College Misericordia is sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy Dallas Regional Community, a member institution of the Institute of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas.

The flags on the Commencement stage today represent the countries where Sisters and Associates from the Dallas Regional Community and faculty and students from College Misericordia have ministered. Also included are the flags of our graduates who are from foreign countries. The United Nations flag represents the Sisters of Mercy's NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) status.
