

Class of 2011

The 85th annual Commencement ceremony features 630 graduates, the largest graduating class in Misericordia University's rich 87-year history. Today's graduates hail from 14 states, including Alaska, California, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia.

Several of our graduates have decided to pursue graduate degrees at prominent institutions of higher education, while others have accepted employment from noteworthy employers. Two biochemistry majors will pursue their Ph.D.s at Ivy League schools, while also working as graduate assistants. One will pursue her graduate degree in computational physical chemistry at Princeton University and the second will major in molecular and cellular biology at Dartmouth College. A third biochemistry major is going to continue her academic career at Albert Einstein Medical College. In pre-law, a student will work towards his Juris Doctorate degree at Albany Law School.

A medical imaging graduate had the highest test score in the nation, placing in the 100th percentile, on her American Registry of Radiologic Technologists national certification exam in radiography, while a fellow classmate has been accepted into the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill Radiation Therapy program — one of only four students accepted by the program.

Several occupational therapy graduates have received career placements at prestigious facilities. One student will work in the Baltimore, Md., public school system and another will work with the geriatric population at an HCR ManorCare facility in Arlington, Va. Other members of the OT graduating class will work at Geisinger Wyoming Valley Medical Center, Wilkes-Barre, Pa.; Aegis Therapies/Golden Living Center, Wilkes-Barre, Pa.; People First Rehabilitation at Timber Ridge Health Care Center in Wilkes-Barre, Pa.; Devon Manor Post Acute Rehabilitation Center, Devon, Pa.; Englewood Hospital & Medical Center, N.J., in an acute care hospital setting; ProRehab; Easter Seals, Salisbury, Md.; and at the University of Maryland Medical Center in the Department of Psychiatry on the geriatric unit.

Members of the SLP graduating class have been recognized with various awards, including the Von Drach Memorial Scholarship that is presented to the outstanding SLP student in Pennsylvania, and with jobs at Willow Valley Retirement Center, Bacharach Institute for Rehabilitation, Magee Rehabilitation, St. Joseph's Center, Phoebe Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, Genesis, Conestoga View Nursing and Rehabilitation, and the Center for Pediatric Therapy.

Nicholas DeBenedictis

Nicholas DeBenedictis, chairman, CEO and president of Aqua America, is a successful businessman who has given tirelessly of himself and of his talent for the betterment of others. He has received numerous awards for his public service and civic leadership, and he has also received honorary degrees from Widener and Drexel Universities.



"Mr. DeBenedictis has distinguished himself as a leader in both the public and private sectors," said Michael A. MacDowell,

president of Misericordia University. "As secretary of the Department of Environmental Resources, he led the way in developing and implementing policies that preserved the environment while helping the Commonwealth to grow.

"As president of Aqua America, he has carried on that tradition by shepherding one of the state's great assets — our water resources — and again helping our Commonwealth to grow."

Prior to joining Aqua America, Mr. DeBenedictis spent three years (1989-1992) as senior vice president of corporate and public affairs for PECO Energy, a \$4 billion nuclear utility. He was responsible for government relations, economic development and environmental policies, plus implementation of the utility's public policy positions.

From 1986 to 1989, he was president of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. Mr. DeBenedictis successfully designed and implemented various economic and business development programs to service the chamber's growing membership, which dramatically increased to more than 5,500 businesses, putting it among the five largest in the nation.

Mr. DeBenedictis also held two cabinet positions for Pennsylvania Gov. Dick Thornburg, serving as secretary of the Department of Environmental Resources from 1983-86 and director of the Office of Economic Development from 1981-83. Before joining the cabinet, he spent eight years with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, first as the assistant regional administrator for Region 3, based in Philadelphia, before being transferred to serve in Washington, D.C., from 1980-81.

He has received numerous awards for public service and civic leadership, including the 2010 Ellipse Award for Improvement of Quality of Life Through Infrastructure, the 2009 Heart of Philadelphia Award, the 2008 Man of the Year Award, the 2007 Entrepreneur of the Year Award and the 1995 Distinguished Citizen of the Year Award.

Mr. DeBenedictis was elected chairman of the Philadelphia Convention & Visitors Bureau's board of directors in 2004 and chaired former Philadelphia Mayor John Street's 21st Century Review Forum Regional Cooperation Committee. He currently serves on the policy committee of the Pennsylvania Business Council and on the board and executive committee of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. He also serves on the board of directors for many regional businesses, and economic and environmental organizations.

Mr. DeBenedictis received both his bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree in environmental engineering and science from Drexel University.

During the commencement ceremony, Misericordia will present Mr. DeBenedictis with an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters Degree.

Charles "Rusty" Flack, Jr., chairman and CEO of Diamond Consolidated Industries, is an entrepreneur, civic leader and philanthropist who has been providing invaluable leadership to Misericordia University for many years and who has been a staple of support for worthy causes throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania.



Mr. Flack of Dallas Township, Pa., served on the Board of Trustees at Misericordia University from 1988-93 and again from 2000-09, serving as the vice chair of the

financial stability committee. He continues to serve as chair of the board's investment committee. His business expertise and leadership were vital to Misericordia during pivotal years in the institution's history, as it transitioned to a university and to the nationally recognized and regionally acclaimed University it is today.

"Rusty Flack's commitment to the greater Wilkes-Barre community has been phenomenal," said Misericordia University President Michael A. MacDowell. "His service as a Trustee and his work with numerous organizations in our Valley and beyond have served as an inspiration to all of us. Rusty has been selfless in all that he has undertaken.



Diamond Consolidated Industries is the largest supplier of perforated metals in North America. He has led the family-owned business with his partner and brother, Harold, who serves as president, since 1979. In 2001, Diamond Consolidated Industries was listed as one of the best places to work in Pennsylvania. In 1998, the business received the Wilkes-Barre Chamber's Small Business of the Year Award. Mr. Flack was awarded the Community Service Award in 2004 from B'nai B'rith for giving of himself unselfishly and with devotion in the mission of promoting the highest interests of humanity. Mr. Flack's family received the Outstanding Philanthropist Award from the Association of Fund Raising Professionals in 2001. He received the Luzerne Foundation's Mary Bevevino Community Service Award in 2009.

"Rusty has been a dear friend and mentor for many years," said Paul "Chip" Siegel, Chair of the Misericordia University Board of Trustees. "His success in the business world has enabled him to be even more successful in helping the community he holds so dear to his heart. He is a great community citizen. Rusty has provided financial support for many worthwhile civic programs and he continually offers his own time and talent for the betterment of others and Northeastern Pennsylvania."

"Passing through Misericordia's beautiful archway in 1970 was exhilarating," said Mrs. Burke, recalling her first memories of Misericordia. "Being taught by Catherine McAuley-inspired sisters and


Misericordia's lay teachers opened my eyes and heart to a pathway where I found numerous opportunities to serve.

"My degree as a home economics and dietetics major provided me with the foundation and inspiration to create the Greater Pittston Food Pantry and Knitting Ministry. God's grace and Catherine's example encouraged the desire. I am deeply honored to be recognized by my alma mater with the Catherine McAuley Award," she added.

Mrs. Burke personifies the tenants that guide Misericordia and the entire campus community. The McAuley Medal is periodically bestowed upon an individual in recognition of their significant service to Misericordia University and the values it upholds and represents.

Mrs. Burke is a member of Misericordia University's class of 1974, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in dietetics. She also holds a certificate in spiritual direction from the Institute for Contemporary Spirituality at The University of Scranton and a certificate in parish ministry foundation from the Pastoral Formation Institute.

The West Pittston resident's civic mindedness has left an indelible impression on her Greater Pittston and parish communities, according to Monsignor John J. Bendik, a member of the Misericordia University Board of Trustees and the pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Church in Pittston, Pa. "Peggy was involved from the ground floor in our deliberations relative to a health clinic," said Monsignor Bendik, who nominated her for the prestigious award. "We were attempting to discern if we were meeting or creating a need. We discovered that the need in the area is beyond anyone's imagination.



A former member of the Misericordia University Alumni Association, Mrs. Burke is a lector and Eucharistic minister at St. John the Evangelist Parish and an advocate for those most in need. She is the founder and coordinator of The Greater Pittston Food Pantry; a board member and nutritionist for the Care & Concern Free Health Clinic; the founder of The Knitting Ministry; a member of the Healing Hearts Bereavement Support Team; and is a board member for the Greater Pittston Meals on Wheels and a weekly meal delivery volunteer.

Mrs. Burke has also volunteered for the Principal's Advisory Council at the former Seton Catholic High School. At St. Mary's Assumption School, she served as a volunteer librarian, book fair chairperson and worked with the Principal's Advisory Board. The greater community acknowledged her selfless service to others when she was named the Greater Pittston Person of the Year in 2009 by The Sunday Dispatch newspaper. The Wyoming Valley Women's Club named her Woman of the Year in 2009.

"Mrs. Burke is an inveterate servant leader," said Misericordia University President Michael A. MacDowell. "She undertakes volunteer, Church and community responsibilities without any thought to herself. Her only concern is for others. As an alumna of Misericordia University and a daughter of the Valley, she learned early on that helping others is a reward within itself and she has always acted accordingly."

Mrs. Burke is married to The Honorable Judge Thomas F. Burke, Jr. The couple has five children.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY Drab American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, Misericordia University's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving University honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.


SPORT MANAGEMENT Sage Green The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the University campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy liberal arts education and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit, which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the University: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the University from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The University Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.
