

Class of 2016

The Class of 2016 will make history as they participate in the 90th annual Commencement ceremony at Misericordia. The Religious Sisters of Mercy founded Misericordia as Luzerne County's first four-year institution of higher learning in 1924. Each year at Commencement, we pay homage to the Sisters' foresight and dedication to education by sending forth graduates who understand and embrace the charisms of Mercy, Service, Justice and Hospitality. The program will honor graduate and undergraduate degree recipients separately at morning and afternoon events.

The graduate ceremony will recognize 104 graduates who hail from seven states, including Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia. The 33 speech-language pathology students represent the largest number of recipients from a single graduate degree program, followed by 30 Master of Science degree students in occupational therapy.

The undergraduate Commencement ceremony will acknowledge 288 students from 12 states, including Alabama, Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania and Virginia, as well as Puerto Rico.

The 44 students earning Bachelor of Science in Nursing degrees represent the largest number of graduates from an academic program at the undergraduate ceremony. The next two most populous majors are business administration with 25 students receiving undergraduate degrees and medical imaging with 23 degree recipients.

Misericordia University is proud of the Class of 2016, and we wish our graduates well as they prepare to enter the next important phase of their lives. Misericordia's newest alumni understand and embrace what makes Misericordia special and will always be Misericordia Proud.

Rear Admiral Scott F. Giberson

West Wyoming, Pennsylvania native Rear Admiral (RADM) Scott F. Giberson is assistant U.S. surgeon general and former acting deputy surgeon general of the United States. RADM Giberson served as the leader of Commissioned Corps Headquarters for the 6,700-plus members of the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and provided direction and control over policy, readiness, deployment and all operations. RADM Giberson also served as the overall commander for



the Commissioned Corps' Ebola Response in West Africa.

RADM Giberson began his Commissioned Corps career in 1994 as a clinical pharmacist at Indian Health Service (IHS). He maintains dual licensure as a pharmacist and clinician and was credentialed as a part-time member of an IHS Family Practice Medical staff for a number of years. He has authored articles in many publications and served as adjunct faculty at multiple universities.

RADM Giberson has served in many Corps roles as a pharmacist, clinician, senior public health advisor and executive leader. In 2001, RADM Giberson responded to the Anthrax attacks in New York City and was a founding member of the Department of Homeland Security. In 2003, RADM Giberson was detailed to the Department of Defense Pacific Command where he lead HIV/AIDS programs involving more than 23 countries.

RADM Giberson has received numerous awards, including the Department of Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Surgeon General's Medallion and a Secretary's Meritorious Medal. He holds a bachelor's degree in pharmacy from Temple University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; a master's in public health from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, Massachusetts, and a graduate certificate in health emergencies in large populations.

He also was awarded the Corps' first-ever Presidential Unit Citation – awarded to him by President Obama in the Oval Office – for the Corps' response to Ebola. In October 2015, RADM Giberson received his second star to Rear Admiral Upper Half.

RADM Giberson will receive an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree during the ceremony.



Thomas M. Check, D.D.S., of Gwynedd Valley, Pennsylvania, will be recognized during the graduate Commencement ceremony for his work as a humanitarian to the people of Jamaica. Dr. Check is the husband of the late Misericordia alumna Elizabeth "Betty" Kern Check, Class of 1949, who passed away in 2008.



A Wilkes-Barre native, Dr. Check graduated from Temple University dental school in 1952 and began the

general practice of dentistry in Norristown, Pennsylvania, in 1953. He continues to practice in partnership with his son, Thomas C. Check, as Penn Square Dental Associates, P.C.

Showing a passion for humanitarianism as early as 1963, Dr. Check responded to a request from the Catholic Medical Mission Board to create a dental care program to "save children's teeth" at the Sisters of Mercy-run Alpha Orphanage in Kingston, Jamaica. In tandem with fellow dentist Dr. Hugh Day, he is credited with developing Project Alpha that established a dental clinic at the orphanage in 1964. In 1965, he made his first trip to Jamaica to oversee the efforts and administer dental care to underprivileged children at the clinic. Under his leadership, Project Alpha expanded to the St. John Bosco Boys Home in Mandeville, Jamaica in 1983, which is also operated by the Sisters of Mercy. The projects' successes and his efforts have earned praise from the Journal of the American Dental Association, U.S. Senate, and from the Ministry of Health of Jamaica.

In 2015, he celebrated 50 consecutive years of travel to Jamaica and involvement in the Alpha and Bosco dental programs. For his efforts, Misericordia will award him with a Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

McCann began her career at Misericordia as coordinator of the Alternative Learner's Project and instructor of professional studies in 1985. She was named associate professor of teacher education in 1990.

In 2001, she instituted the Student Teaching Experiences Abroad program at Misericordia to offer student teachers the opportunity to study and teach in Ireland. Sister McCann also developed "Project Approach," a program instituted in 2006 that links students from Misericordia's early childhood education classes with elementary students at Little Meadows Learning Center and Gate of Heaven School, Dallas, Pennsylvania.


Her exemplary efforts earned her two of the three highest honors awarded to Misericordia faculty - the Max and Tillie Rosenn Excellence in Teaching Award in 1989 and the Pauly and Sidney Friedman Excellence in Service Award in 2011. The Friedman Award recognized her for a career of service, including ministry to the Catherine McAuley House shelter for homeless women and children, where since 2005 she has volunteered in a variety of roles including as an overnight volunteer, coordinator of student volunteers, and receptionist.

Upon her retirement in 2014, the Teacher Education Department instituted The Sister Pat McCann Award, an academic award given annually to recognize a student who embodies and embraces the charisms of the Sisters of Mercy - Mercy, Service, Justice and Hospitality.

Remaining active, she currently assists with the Dinners for Kids program, which provides nutritionally balanced meals year-round to underprivileged children in the Wyoming Valley West School District. She also volunteers to serve lunches to patients at the Meadows Nursing Center, Dallas.

Larry D. Shinn, Ph.D.

Larry D. Shinn, Ph.D., is president emeritus of Berea College, Berea, Kentucky, and a professor of religious studies. Dr. Shinn began his 42-year higher education career as a professor at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio; served as a dean and academic vice president at Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania; and subsequently led Berea College as president from 1994-2012.

Given his background and experience, Dr. Shinn now works collaboratively with presidents and boards of trustees on presidential coaching and assessment, board assessment and development, and ways to use strategic thinking effectively in institutional transformation.

Dr. Shinn earned his Bachelor of Arts from Baldwin-Wallace College, Berea, Ohio; his Masters of Divinity from Drew Theological School, Madison, New Jersey; and his Ph.D. in the history of religions from Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey. During the Commencement ceremony, Misericordia University will present Dr. Shinn with an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY Drab American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, Misericordia University's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving University honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.

THE MACE


The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the University campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy liberal arts education and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit, which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the University: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the University from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The University Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.
