

## Class of 2018

The Misericordia University Spring Commencement ceremonies feature 122 graduate and 330 undergraduate students from 14 states, including Arizona, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, North Carolina, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas.

The 42 students earning Master of Science degrees in occupational therapy represent the largest number of graduates from an academic program at the graduate ceremony. The next two most populous graduate majors are speech-language pathology with 32 students and 18 in nursing.

The University conferred 142 Bachelor of Science in health science degrees during the undergraduate ceremony. Sixty-two graduates received Bachelor of Science in nursing degrees, while 29 earned Bachelor of Science in business administration degrees.

The University has a rich 94-year tradition of preparing students to succeed in life and in their chosen field of study by providing them with individualized attention, challenging academics and superb career preparation, while also imbuing in each student a passion to serve others.



## Mary Jo Leddy, Ph.D.

Mary Jo Leddy, Ph.D., the founder and director of the Romero House Community for Refugees in Toronto, Canada, and founding editor of the former Catholic New Times, is a scholar, teacher, social activist and journalist, who has traveled the world extensively for human rights, peace and religious concerns.



Germany, Israel, Lebanon, Poland, the former Soviet Union, and Spain.

As the founder and director of the Romero House Community for Refugees, Dr. Leddy has overseen several waves of refugees from Africa, Columbia, Eastern Europe, Iran, Mexico and the former Soviet Union for almost 25 years.

At the University of Toronto, Dr. Leddy is an adjunct professor at Regis College and a senior fellow in Massey College. In addition to being a columnist for the Toronto Star newspaper and a radio and TV commentator, she is a member of several human rights and peace groups. Dr. Leddy also lectures on various topics nationally and internationally.

Dr. Leddy has written seven books and received numerous awards in recognition of her career. In 1978, the Canadian University President's Award recognized her as an "Outstanding Young Woman" and in 1996 she received the Order of Canada. Through the years, she also has received the Governor General's Bronze Medal, Canada Council Doctoral Fellowship, the Ida Nudel Human Rights Award, the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews Human Relations Award, the Roman Catholic Communicators of Canada Award for Distinguished Contribution, the Ontario Citizenship Award, Gunther Plaut Humanitarian Award, several press awards, and many more.

Dr. Leddy holds Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Education, Master of Arts and doctorate degrees from the University of Toronto. Her doctoral studies focused on philosophy of religion and political thought, with an emphasis on political philosopher Hannah Arendt's approach to the Holocaust.

Misericordia University will present Dr. Leddy with an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree during the graduate commencement ceremony.

## Sandra Rossi Kurtinitis, Ph.D.

Sandra Rossi Kurtinitis, Ph.D., the president of the Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) and a Wilkes-Barre, Pa., native, is a tireless and dynamic supporter of accessible, affordable and high-quality education that prepares students for career success.

A community college professional for more than 50 years, Dr. Kurtinitis has been the president of CCBC since 2005, while also serving higher education as the current chair-elect of the American Association of Community Colleges Board of Directors,



and as a member of the Maryland Association of Community Colleges and the Community College Humanities Association boards of directors.

A self-described servant-leader, the GAR High School graduate is resolutely committed to inclusive leadership and open communication, affirming her belief that the classroom is a far more important place on campus than the executive office. Under Dr. Kurtinitis' leadership, CCBC has made significant strides in improving service to students while strengthening its operational areas to best support instruction. She supports a lean executive structure, bringing strong central leadership across the college while fostering a collaborative, learning-centered environment throughout the institution.

Educating more than 60,000 students annually, CCBC has received many accolades during Dr. Kurtinitis' tenure. The college received the Kohlberg Prize twice for championing issues related to student veterans. It also is the recipient of the Leah Meyer Austin Leadership Award for Student Success, presented by Achieving the Dream. Community College Week magazine has named CCBC among the "Top 100 Associate Degree Producers" in the United States.

Dr. Kurtinitis has a reputation as a thought-provoking leader and is a trusted resource for local, county and state legislators, and has received several invitations to the White House to participate in discussions regarding higher education and college attainment.

Dr. Kurtinitis earned her undergraduate degree from Misericordia University and a Master of Arts from the University of Maryland. She earned her doctorate from George Washington University, Washington, D.C. Prior to joining CCBC, Dr. Kurtinitis was the president of Quinsigamond Community College in Worcester, Massachusetts, from 1995-2005. In addition, she has published four books, written numerous articles, and been recognized with numerous awards, including her most recent induction into the Chesapeake Gateway Chamber's Hall of Fame in January 2018.

HISTORY White American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black

silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, Misericordia University's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving University honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.


The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the University campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy liberal arts education and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit, which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the University: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the University from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The University Mace was designed and executed by Regina Kiel, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.
