The Misericordia University Spring Commencement ceremonies feature 119 graduate and 298 undergraduate students from 17 states, including Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.

Among the academic programs with the most graduates, the College of Health Sciences and Education will award 83 Bachelor of Science in health science degrees and 52 Bachelor of Science in nursing degrees. In addition, the college is awarding 42 Master of Science degrees from the five-year, entry-level occupational therapy program and 32 Master of Science degrees from the five-year speech-language pathology program. The College of Business is presenting 32 Bachelor of Science degrees in business administration. The College of Arts and Sciences will award 11 Bachelor of Arts degrees in English and 10 in government, law, and national security.

Misericordia University is a Catholic, liberal arts institution established in the tradition of the Sisters of Mercy. Luzerne County's first four-year college fosters intellectual curiosity, critical thinking and respect for people in an environment where all are welcome.

Brennan O'Donnell, Ph.D., and Angela Alaimo O'Donnell, Ph.D.



Brennan O'Donnell, Ph.D., and his wife, Angela Alaimo O'Donnell, Ph.D., return to their native Wyoming Valley to share the talent and knowledge they have accumulated after serving in higher education.



Dr. Brennan O'Donnell is the president of Manhattan College, a liberal arts college based in the Catholic tradition in Bronx, N.Y. He has served as the 19th president of the private institution since 2009 after being the dean of Fordham College at Rose Hill for five years. President O'Donnell also spent 17 years at Loyola University Maryland as a professor of English and director of the universitywide honors program. An active scholar, his teaching and research interests focus mainly on poetry, especially of the British Romantic period, and on religion and literature, particularly contemporary American Catholic writers.

President O'Donnell has authored two books on the poetry of William Wordsworth and co-edited *The Work of*

Andre Dubus, a collection of essays published as a double issue of Religion and the Arts. In addition, he has published articles, essays, and reviews in some of the leading journals in his field. In 2014, President O'Donnell won the prestigious Robert Fitzgerald Prosody Award, which recognizes scholars whose work has "made a lasting contribution to the art and science of versification."

A frequent contributor to national and international conversations about the current state and future prospects of Catholic higher education, President O'Donnell served as editor of the national magazine, Conversations on Jesuit Higher Education, from 1994-00, and as a member of the National Seminar on Jesuit Higher Education from 1993-00. He currently serves on the Board of Trustees of Lewis University and the Board of Directors of the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, and chairs the Lasallian Association of Colleges and Universities.

President O'Donnell and Dr. Alaimo O'Donnell earned their Bachelor of Arts degrees with highest distinction and honors in English at The Pennsylvania State University. They earned their Master of Arts degrees and Ph.Ds in English and American literature and language at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

The couple has a special affinity for Misericordia University and Northeastern Pennsylvania. A native of Kingston, Pa., President O'Donnell's late mother, Mary Patricia (Brennan) O'Donnell, was a member of the Class of 1939, and his late aunt, Sister Miriam R. Brennan, RSM, was a member of the Class of 1950. Dr. O'Donnell is a native of West Wyoming, Pa.

Dr. O'Donnell is an award-winning writer, a professor at Fordham University in New York City, and the associate director of Fordham's Curran Center for American Catholic Studies. She has published seven collections of poetry, a memoir, and a biography of fiction writer Flannery O'Connor. Dr. O'Donnell also writes scholarly studies of contemporary and Catholic literature and is a former columnist and a regular contributor to *America* magazine. She will read a poem written for the Class of 2019 during the ceremony.

The legacy of Misericordia's 12th presidency is omnipresent in many forms. From John J. Passan Hall and Tambur Field in the Anderson Outdoor Athletic Complex to the addition of innovative academic and athletic programs, the accomplishments of Michael A. and Tina MacDowell remain a vivid reminder on the impact they had on Luzerne County's first four-year college.

Together, the MacDowells embraced their adopted home in the Back Mountain and set about making an impact on this

institution of higher education, the communities surrounding it, and the region it serves in Northeastern Pennsylvania. For a president with a 24-7 reputation, he had a very practical approach to growing the prestige of Misericordia: increase fundraising, admissions, and visibility of the college.

Fifteen years later, that approach proved to be a winning formula. It enabled Misericordia to grow from a regional, Catholic college to a regionally acclaimed and nationally recognized university based in the liberal arts. During his presidency, the endowment grew from \$4 million to more than \$23 million, and, overall, the institution raised more than \$60 million from private and government sources. From 1998-2013, enrollment nearly tripled from 1,050 to an all-time record of 3,012 students.

The campus community acknowledged the couple's significant leadership and accomplishments in 2012 by dedicating Michael and Tina MacDowell Hall, a 37,000-square-foot building, in their honor. It was made possible by a \$1 million pledge from the Board of Trustees. That steadfast commitment to Misericordia continues in retirement, as the MacDowells remain engaged with this academic community.

The Alumni Association will present them with the Honorary Alumni Award during the graduate ceremony. The award honors individuals who are not graduates yet have made significant contributions toward its welfare and prestige, and have shown lifelong devotion and demonstrative loyalty. The alumni association gives the award only when it wishes to honor an exceptional person or couple.

"Our 15 years at Misericordia were the most memorable of our lives," said Michael A. MacDowell, Ed.D., who retired in 2013 as president emeritus. "They were made more so by an alumni body that cared deeply about their alma mater and the role it played in their lives. Just to be considered honorary members of that dedicated and caring group makes us very proud."

Tanya M. Trippett, M.D.

Tanya M. Trippett, M.D., a pediatric hematologic oncologist at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, has spent her distinguished medical career battling cancer, especially lymphomas in young patients.

That treatment is not limited in scope as she focuses intently on clinical research to design and assess investigational therapies for children with all types of cancers. Dr. Trippett is the co-founder of the Pediatric Oncology Experimental Therapeutics Investigator



Consortium (POETIC), a collaboration between multiple centers across the country whose mission is the development of biologically targeted therapies for cancers that have recurred in children. Together, the centers work to increase patients' access to promising new agents in clinical trials.

Dr. Trippett served as the director of the POETIC Coordinating Center at Memorial Sloan Kettering until recently, when she transitioned her efforts to building an international children's cancer research center in Ghana. She is currently building the capacity of two charities focused on the health of children, which she leads as president – the POETIC Foundation and the Eugene Gasana Jr. Foundation.

Dr. Trippett, whose background includes molecular pharmacology and therapeutics laboratory research, also served the national Children's Oncology Group as chairperson of the Hodgkin's Biology Committee and vice chairperson of the Hodgkin's Disease Committee for 12 years.

Her transcendent research and dedication to the care of children with cancer has resulted in numerous awards and accolades from her peers. Dr. Trippett was named a Diamond Member of the International Association of Pediatricians in 2010 and has been recognized with The Leading Physicians of the World honor every years since 2010. She received the title of Castle Connolly Top Doctor in Pediatric Hematology-Oncology in 2013 and, in 2015, received the UBS Women Leaving a Legacy Award. In 2018, she received the Great African Shine Award.

Dr. Trippett earned her Bachelor of Arts and Science degrees, summa cum laude, from Spelman College in Georgia, where she was also the class valedictorian. She received her Doctor of Medicine degree from Duke University School of Medicine.

Misericordia University will present Dr. Trippett with an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree during the undergraduate commencement ceremony.

HISTORY White American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black

silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, Misericordia University's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving University honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.
