

CLASS OF 2008

The 82nd annual Commencement ceremony features 546 graduates who will be the first to receive a diploma from Misericordia University during its rich 84-year history.

Misericordia's second largest graduating class hails from 13 states, including Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Ohio, Connecticut, Maryland, Massachusetts, Delaware, Virginia, Rhode Island, Hawaii, Maine and Washington.

The 70 nursing students represent the largest number of graduates from a single field in this year's class. Combined with Physical Therapy, Speech-Language Pathology, Occupational Therapy and Medical Imaging, a new collection of Misericordia graduates are going on to rewarding careers in the health sciences.

Several of our graduates will continue their educations at prestigious graduate schools. A Certified Nurse Specialist graduate student will seek his doctorate in nursing at The State University of New York, and a biology major will seek her doctorate degree at the New York College of Osteopathic Medicine. An English major will attend graduate school at the University of Glasgow in Scotland.

Two students in the distinctive Women with Children program are among our graduates today, the seventh and eighth to graduate from the program since it was established in 2000. A member of our nursing class was formally commissioned as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy prior to Commencement.

Misericordia University is proud of the Class of 2008 as they prepare to enter the next important phase in their lives. MU's newest alumni understand the Religious Sisters of Mercy's charisms of mercy, service, justice and hospitality, and will always be Misericordia Proud.



John P. Martin, Ed.D.

John P. Martin, Ed.D., has spent a lifetime shaping and establishing secondary, undergraduate and graduate educational opportunities for children and young adults in Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Luzerne County.

One of the founding fathers of West Side Central Catholic High School — the former Bishop O'Reilly High School — in Kingston and Luzerne County Community College (LCCC) in Nanticoke, Dr. Martin has served his community, profession and faith with dignity and compassion.



Dr. Martin earned his bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Bonaventure University and his master's in psychology and counseling from the University of Scranton. He received his doctorate degree in higher education from the Pennsylvania State University, where he wrote his doctoral dissertation, "The Establishment of Luzerne County Community College: A Case Study."

A lifelong learner, Dr. Martin also earned 244 graduate credits in philosophy, administration of allied health education, educational administration, guidance and theological studies.

As a young man, Dr. Martin had a "real familiarity with the mission" of the Religious Sisters of Mercy thanks to his Irish-born parents and a close family friend. The way he interpreted that mission, though, evolved as he established himself as a young professional in higher education and health care. "I grew up and it became clear to me that they were talking about the right of higher education," he recently said about the Religious Sisters of Mercy's mission.

"I wanted to get into the next emerging right in the United States, the right to health care" he adds about his positions with RSM health care facilities. "That was a big discussion during the time of the Kennedy Administration. It was a real privilege to join them on their missions."

As a charter Trustee from 1966-75, Dr. Martin helped establish LCCC for countless college students and adult learners in Northeastern Pennsylvania. He was a member of LCCC's executive and personnel committees and

actively engaged in the recruitment and selection of the two-year institution's first president. Dr. Martin also designed policies to establish a solid working relationship between the Board of Trustees and the President.

Misericordia University and LCCC have had an articulation agreement for more than 30 years. Today, many current students and MU alumni began their collegiate careers by earning their associate's degree in Nanticoke before transferring to Misericordia to complete their bachelor's or master's degrees.

At Misericordia, Dr. Martin was an associate professor for education, psychology and philosophy, and campus chaplain from 1967-71. He has served Misericordia since 2002 on the President's Council and played an instrumental role in the development of the Bachelor of Science degree in health care management through the Expressway program for adult learners.

Dr. Martin and his late wife, Mrs. Ann Marie Gerrity Martin, also established the Frederick and Sarah Joyce Gerrity Endowed Scholarship to benefit needy students.

"I continue to be a believer in their mission and try to help them in every way possible," Dr. Martin adds.

His career in education has been highlighted by the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey designating him founding dean emeritus in 2002 for the School of Health Related Professions. Dr. Martin was the founding dean at the School of Health Related Professions from 1975-90. He also served the college as acting program director for physical therapy and acting chairperson for the department of radiation and imaging sciences.

Dr. Martin was also the associate and acting dean of the College of Allied Health Professions at Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital in Philadelphia from 1972-75. He was the assistant superintendent of schools for kindergarten through 12th grades for the Diocese of Scranton from 1965-67.


Dr. Martin has extended his professional acumen to numerous professional and civic organization boards throughout his professional and personal life. He acted as chairperson for the Sisters of Mercy Health Corporation's Board of Trustees and was a member of the board of directors for Mercy Health Services in Michigan. Dr. Martin was a member of the federal task force on Guidance in Catholic Secondary Education and has been a member of the American Association for Higher Education since 1968.

I continue to be a believer in their (the Religious Sisters of Mercy) mission and try to help them in every way possible, Dr. Martin adds.




Mr. David and Mrs. Julie Nixon Eisenhower

Mr. Eisenhower served his country as a naval officer and Mrs. Eisenhower has been listed four times among the Ten Most Admired Women in America by Good Housekeeping magazine for her lifelong work as a volunteer.

From 2001-03, Mr. Eisenhower was editor-in-chief of the Foreign Policy Research Institute's (FPRI) Orbis journal. He currently is co-chair of FPRI's Teaching Institute. The author of numerous magazine articles and book reviews on the subjects of politics and history, he has lectured widely to audiences across the country on the presidency, foreign relations and World War II.

The grandson of President Dwight D. Eisenhower is a graduate of Amherst College and a three-year veteran of the United States Navy, where he served as an officer aboard the guided missile cruiser, Albany. In 1976, he earned his Juris Doctor from The Law Center at George Washington University. He is the recipient of seven honorary doctorates and is a fellow of the Society of American Historians.



Mrs. Eisenhower is an author, editor and public speaker. She has lectured widely throughout the United States on the presidency, leadership, women in politics and life in the White House. An assistant managing editor of The Saturday Evening Post, she helped establish a book division for the parent company and edited a series of anthologies. She is the author of three books, including the best-selling "Pat Nixon: The Untold Story."

A lifelong volunteer, Good Housekeeping magazine named her one of the Ten Most Admired Women in America four times for her efforts on behalf of children, the elderly and the environment. Through the years, she has served on many nonprofit boards. In 1991, Mrs. Eisenhower was named a Distinguished Daughter of Pennsylvania for her community service. Most of her volunteer efforts since 1988 have been devoted to Jobs for America's Graduates, a nationwide program in 26 states which serves at-risk children. She has served as chair and vice chair of the organization. From 2002-06, Mrs. Eisenhower chaired the President's Commission on White House Fellowships.

Mrs. Eisenhower received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Smith College and a master's degree from the Catholic University of America.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY Drab American academic dress has its origins in the garments worn at medieval British universities, particularly at Oxford, which was founded in the 12th century. At the time, academic institutions were similar to guilds or associations, called universitates. The academic organization was a guild of Masters of Arts, with the bachelor an apprentice.

Gowns and hoods were common clothing in medieval times, with quality and design decreed according to the wearer's social status and wealth. While general fashions changed, academic attire remained the same, both as a tradition and as a means of identifying members of the university. Hoods evolved from a simple head covering or cowl into a symbolic garment with a strictly assigned system of colors and patterns which identified each graduate's institution, rank, and discipline.

The Oxford or "mortar board" cap came into use during the 16th century, but authorities differ on its origin. Some say the cap is square like a scholar's books; others that it was derived from the master workman's mortar board; still others suggest it was patterned after the quadrangular shape of the Oxford campus. A more plausible explanation is that the scholars wore skull caps while they worked indoors and square caps called birettas when they went outdoors; if they simply donned the biretta over their skull cap, the look would be very much like the mortarboard.

Although caps and gowns had been worn in many American schools since Colonial times, in 1885 there was a widespread student movement for their use at commencement ceremonies. The faculties adopted the use of gowns for themselves to wear at academic ceremonies. Each college developed its own arbitrary design and standards, as the British universities had, until the Intercollegiate Commission met to develop a code for academic costume in 1895. The new code regulated design of gowns, hoods, and colors in a way that would signify each scholar's achievements and institution. It was approved by 95 percent of American universities and colleges, and is still in use today.

The official code provides for three types of gowns. Those worn by the bachelors are black and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters may wear either black silk or woolen gowns, made with a long closed sleeve with

an arc appearing near the bottom and a slit for the arm. The doctors' gowns are usually of black silk with full, round, open sleeves. The color of the velvet trim may be black or the same color as the velvet which edges the hood. Although the color is normally black, some institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in their school colors.

The hood is worn at the back, suspended near the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. Bachelors wear a hood which is three feet long, with a two-inch velvet border. The hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long, with a three-inch border. The doctor's hood is four feet long and the border is five inches wide.

The inner lining of the hood is in the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree; therefore, Misericordia University's hood is lined with blue and golden yellow. The color of the velvet border indicates the field of learning in which the degree was earned. Tassels are traditionally black for the bachelor's and master's degrees, and gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

Additional ornaments have been added in some institutions to indicate honors or memberships in honor societies. At Misericordia, a gold stole is worn by graduates receiving College honors; colored cords draped over the robe indicate membership in an honor society; distinctive pins worn on the gown also indicate particular honors.


The mace is made of black walnut and bronze. The dark, rich wood symbolizes the woodlands surrounding the University campus referred to in the Alma Mater.

The unusual shaft works its way from rough cast, difficult beginnings into the textured, polished finish of a double base—angled, yet harmoniously fitted. The form represents the structured ideals of the Sisters of Mercy liberal arts education and the individual struggles for acquisition of knowledge.

Open, free forms of brass represent the open, free spirit, which is the basis of Compassionate Service, while the rich beauty and strength of walnut depict the fullness, value, and strength of Judeo-Christian education.

Highlighting the head of the mace is gleaming, textured bronze in the shape of an open flame. The fire represents two events in the history of the College: the burning of St. Mary's Convent in Wilkes-Barre, which necessitated the Sisters' move to Dallas, and the first night on campus when fires almost prevented the College from ever opening its doors. A flame open to searching for truth, and open to new ideas is symbolic of the light of learning: always striving for, never reaching, the fullness of finish.

The College Mace was designed and executed by Regina Keil, RSM, goldsmith and silversmith. It is a gift of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, Dallas Regional Community.
