SUSAN FORT SORDONI DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, HONORIS CAUSA

Susan Fort Sordoni has been chosen by College Misericordia to receive an honorary degree because of her outstanding efforts in public service to community organizations and to education, at this College as well as throughout the state.

A native of Wilkes-Barre, Susan Sordoni holds a bachelor of science degree from College Misericordia, and has done post-graduate work at Wilkes College and the New School for Social Research.

After graduating from Misericordia in 1968, Mrs. Sordoni took a position with the College as Director of Recruitment and Director of Admissions from 1969 to 1971. Her affiliation with Misericordia continued in 1974 when she joined the Board of Trustees, providing leadership to many of the board committees and serving as board chair from 1979 to 1982. Mrs. Sordoni also chaired Misericordia's Presidential Search Committees in 1978 and again in 1988. Through considerable time and effort, she has been instrumental in the improvement of education on all levels and in helping to continue Misericordia's tradition of service to the region.

Mrs. Sordoni's dedication to public service and civic causes has involved her in leadership roles locally and state-wide, most recently as director of Pennsylvania Blue Shield in Harrisburg, a member and past president of the Commonwealth Board of the Medical College of Pennsylvania, and chair of the Scranton Diocese Committee for Special Education. She is a former trustee and vice-chair of the Board of Trustees of the University of Scranton, a former trustee of the Medical College of Pennsylvania, former chair of the Governor's Advisory Council for Library Development in Pennsylvania, former trustee of the Osterhout Free Library, and a member of many state and local committees.

Known for her work in the community and in education throughout the state, Mrs. Sordoni has been honored with the Volunteer Appreciation Award, presented by Mrs. George Bush, for Service to a Public Library. She also received the Distinguished Service Award presented by the Pennsylvania Library Association, the Pathfinder Award for distinctive service to higher education, and the 1983 Wyoming Valley Interfaith Council award for devoted service to the cause of human welfare, presented to her and her husband, Andrew Sordoni III.

Geography cannot restrict the human spirit; in fact, it often challenges the gifted to find and support community causes that mirror the needs of the world-at-large. It is this quality that the College honors today by paying tribute to an alumna who has made this area her world, has responded to the needs of this area, and hence to the human needs of the world. Great minds and gifted spirits create a world wherever they happen to live. Happily for us, Susan Fort Sordoni lives here, where her community service is vibrant and long-lasting.

The mother of five children, Susan Sordoni has contributed an incredible amount of time and effort to the causes of College Misericordia and to many other community organizations; she continues to be a superb example of the type of leader who plays significant roles in the most significant projects in the world today. Her commitment to education and her concern for public service is therefore recognized today by College Misericordia; Susan Fort Sordoni's achievements truly distinguish her as a worthy recipient of an Honorary Degree.

CAROL RITTNER, R.S.M., Ed. D. DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, HONORIS CAUSA

College Misericordia has chosen to honor Carol Rittner, R.S.M., Ed. D. for her continuing devotion to the cause of religious tolerance and understanding, and for her work as director of the Elie Wiesel Foundation for Humanity in New York. Through her activities as coordinator of international conferences on the Holocaust, her experience and involvement in interreligious dialogue about the Holocaust, and her work in foundation and higher education administration, she has advanced the Mercy mission of peace and justice.

A native of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, Dr. Rittner entered the Religious Sisters of Mercy in Dallas, Pennsylvania in 1962. After receiving a bachelor of arts degree in English in 1967, she taught English in Catholic high schools in Pennsylvania. In 1972 she earned a master of arts degree from the University of Maryland, and received a doctor of education from Pennsylvania State University in 1978. She is pursuing a master of theological studies at St. John's Seminary, Detroit.

Dr. Rittner entered the field of higher education in 1973, when she was appointed director of special programs and planning at Mount Aloysius Junior College in Cresson, Pennsylvania. From 1974 to 1986, she served as administrator and adjunct associate professor of Mercy College of Detroit, coordinating and directing many special programs and projects, and teaching education, English, and religious studies.

In 1984 Dr. Rittner became project director and conference coordinator for the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Council in Washington, D.C. As director she developed and coordinated an international conference to examine the plight of non-Jews during the Nazi domination of Europe. She became director of the Elie Wiesel Foundation in 1987 and is responsible for organizing international conferences under its auspices and for securing funding.

Dr. Rittner's distinguished career is highlighted by many accomplishments. She served as co-executive producer for two nationally acclaimed documentaries on the Holocaust; initiated and directed a one-semester lecture series featuring four Holocaust scholars at Mercy College of Detroit; and directed a three-part slide-tape program on the history and spirit of the Sisters of Mercy. She has published several books and articles about the Holocaust and is in demand as a speaker for both religious and business groups. A former member of Misericordia's Board of Trustees, Dr. Rittner also serves on several committees working to enhance both the Catholic and Jewish faiths.

For all these endeavors, especially for outstanding evidence of remarkable leadership, College Misericordia today confers on Dr. Carol Rittner, R.S.M., her second degree from this institution, this time the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, an honorary degree for an alumna who has brought high honors to this College in exemplifying in her daily work its values and traditions.

MARY CONCILIA MORAN, R.S.M.

It is with deep respect and appreciation that College Misericordia posthumously awards Mary Concilia Moran, R.S.M., the Catherine McAuley Medal. A religious leader and major force in this country's Catholic health care system, Sr. Concilia dedicated her spirit and her life to enriching the life of the community she served.

Sister Concilia began her Mercy ministry in education, teaching elementary school in Gettysburg, Steelton, Littlestown and Harrisburg. She then received her R.N. diploma from Mercy Hospital, Johnstown; a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from College Misericordia; and a Master of Science degree in nursing from Marquette University. She served as director of nursing for the Johnstown Mercy Hospital and its School of Nursing for seven years, and as administrator for another year.

Sister Concilia's leadership abilities were recognized early. In 1970, at age 39, the Province of Scranton elected her to serve the 800 Mercys as Provincial Administrator. One year later, she was the youngest administrator ever elected Administrator General of the 6,000 member Union of Sisters of Mercy, encompassing the entire US and parts of South America. In 1977, she became President of the Federation of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas, a 10,570 member organization of all Mercy communities in the western hemisphere.

Sister Concilia combined her administrative skills with her love for the healing ministry in 1978, when she joined Mercy Health Services, a non-profit health care system sponsored by the Province of Detroit. There she pioneered the sponsorship concept and Mission Effectiveness Program throughout the system. At the time of her death this past January, she was senior vice president of the MHS, one of the largest health care systems in the country.

She held many administrative positions, including a term on College Misericordia's Board of Trustees. She also received many honors, including an award for Distinguished Service to the Catherine McAuley Health Center, 1979 to 1988; and most recently, the 1989 Sister Mary Maurita Sengalaub Award, presented annually to the person whose contributions to the healing ministry of the Sisters of Mercy typify the life and works of the R.S.M.'s founder, Catherine McAuley.

In presenting the McAuley Medal posthumously to Sister Mary Concilia Moran, College Misericordia gratefully acknowledges her contributions to the College, and pays tribute to her selfless devotion to and deep affection for the mission of Mercy.
