HILDA STAUB GAREY

Hilda Garey was enrolled as a student at College Misericordia in its third academic year. This was an era when a liberal education for women was available only to the affluent; when few believed that women should be educated at all.

During her years as a student, Hilda Garey was touched by the idealism of Catherine McAuley, as exemplified by the founding Sisters of Mercy of College Misericordia. Just as Mother McAuley had dedicated her life to the elevation and education of women of the poor and working classes of Ireland that they might overcome the prejudice and injustice of that time, so had the Sisters of Mercy of College Misericordia established College Misericordia for the purpose of providing higher education to the young women of this community who would not otherwise have had the opportunity.

Many students at College Misericordia were impressed with the mission of the Sisters, but none more deeply than Hilda Garey, who embraced it, making it her own.

She carried it with her into the ranks of the alumnae, and became in every sense a leader, driven by the conviction that she as an alumna must help the Sisters of Mercy continue their mission so that future generations might share the opportunity which had been hers.

Three decades of volunteer service included every task necessary to the advancement of her Alma Mater, including two terms as Alumnae President. During the second of these, in 1958, Alumnae Annual Giving, the forerunner of the present Annual Drive, was established. Following this, the College President appointed Hilda Garey to the office of Director of Alumnae Affairs.

As an administrator, Hilda Garey was in a position to capture many of her dreams and make them real. Her efforts resulted in better communications, stronger financial support, and a long list of innovations and improvements. Most of all, she had the trust and affection of her fellow alumnae, who willingly followed her leadership because she seemed to demonstrate at all times, the admonition of Mother McAuley, "We should do first what we would induce others to do."

Hilda Garey chose to retire after twelve years of service to resume her former role as volunteer. Upon her retirement, she received a citation from the American Alumni Council, whose members were aware only of her professional expertise. How could they have known, as do her friends at Misericordia, the depths of her loyalty and love?

In recognition of that loyalty, the Mother Catherine McAuley Medal is presented to Hilda Garey, to whom it must be said, as in the Proverbs, "Many daughters have done virtuously, but you excel them all."

THE HONORABLE JOSEPH M. McDADE, J.D. DOCTOR OF LAWS, HONORIS CAUSA

The Honorable Joseph M. McDade, Member of the United States Congress from the 10th District of Pennsylvania, has served his district, his state and his country for nine terms since 1962. A high ranking legislator in the highest legislative forum in America, Congressman McDade has brought to that forum local concerns of national significance. A college may teach the principles by which justice must be promoted; a legislator must apply those principles to public law for the public good. Ideas and ideals conceived in the liberal lecture halls of academia must liberate those whose lives depend on the work completed in committee rooms on Capitol Hill.

Joseph McDade received his undergraduate degree from the University of Notre Dame with honors. He later earned his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania. Almost at the beginning of his political career he was named one of the Ten Outstanding Young Men in the United States in 1964. His career of civic service has been consistently highlighted by his dedication to the principles at issue in the area he represents: revitalization of the anthracite coal industry, and its long-range implications for national energy conservation; preservation of Pennsylvania's remarkably beautiful parks and forests; examination of the impact of organized crime on the lives of the urban poor.

In these arenas in which Congressman McDade has concentrated his efforts to create public law for public good, his accomplishments are immediately evident. First in the ranks on the subcommittee on Interior and Related Agencies, he is directly involved in the funding of the nation's energy programs, National Parks and Forests and mining and metalurgy research and safety plans. All of these causes are imperative to the civic life of his native Northeastern Pennsylvania.

He was instrumental in establishing the Anthracite Coal Task Force and, through the Subcommittee, he has initiated a series of new research efforts utilizing anthracite coal. For instance, McDade secured the funds for a new program to extract high quality anthracite coal from culm refuse. The first demonstration plant under this new program began operation in Northeastern Pennsylvania in late 1977. He has also been a leader in the Subcommittee's efforts to increase development of domestic oil resources.

Since justice demands that energy efforts be protective of environmental interests, it is altogether fitting and proper that Congressman McDade has secured passage of legislation in the 95th Congress to create a new center for environmental education at Grey Towers, the Gifford Pinchot Home, in Milford, Pike County, Pennsylvania. In 1978 he was honored by the National Recreation and Park Association as the Legislator of the Year for his leadership in conservation.

Early in his career in Congress, McDade took the lead in attacking organized crime. He formed a study group of twenty-three other Members to examine the impact of crime on the urban poor. This study produced a new law that made loan sharking a federal crime. Within months of its passage in 1968, Federal agents began making arrests of credit extortionists.

After serving only two years on the Banking Committee, he secured an appointment to the powerful House Appropriations Committee which controls the allocation of funds for all federal government activities.

Congressman McDade is a member of the Board of Trustees of Keystone Junior College, La Plume, Pennsylvania; the Robert Packer Hospital, Sayre, Pennsylvania; the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.; historic Ford's Theatre in Washington, D.C.; and is a member of the Board of Regents of the prestigious Woodrow Wilson Center for Scholars in Washington, D.C.

To confer an honorary degree on Congressman Joseph M. McDade is for College Misericordia an occasion to call academic attention to the civic contributions his work has brought to this part of the state. The mission statement of this College calls us to the promotion of justice; the career accomplishments of the Honorable Joseph McDade from 1962 to 1981 have promoted principles of justice that enable civic life to flourish in Northeastern Pennsylvania. What he has learned in academic lecture halls he has effectively brought to life in the national legislative forum where all laws must reflect the principles of justice that first brought them into being.

DORIS E. HADARY, Ph.D. DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS, HONORIS CAUSA

Doris E. Hadary has been chosen to receive an honorary degree from College Misericordia in recognition of her remarkable career devoted to both the advancement of science and the art of advancing the causes of those whom science seeks to help, disabled and handicapped children.

A native of Chicago, Dr. Hadary did her undergraduate studies in Bacteriology and Chemistry at the University of Illinois. She continued her education in these areas at the University of Wisconsin where she received an M.S. degree, at the George Washington University where she evinced a deepening interest in secondary education, at the Catholic University of America where she did specialized studies in Radiobiology and Biochemistry, and again, at the University of Wisconsin where she completed studies for a doctoral degree combining both Chemistry and Education. Since then she has studied the scientific bases of health care both at home and abroad.

A Professor of Chemistry at the American University in Washington, D.C., Dr. Hadary in her professional activities has consistently since 1972 concentrated her time, her skills, her tremendous learning and her equally tremendous energies on alerting the nation and the world at large to the problems of children who are blind or deaf or emotionally disturbed, those whom society with tenderness and compassion have learned to call Exceptional. For the continuance of this work Dr. Hadary has, from 1972 to 1981 received grants totalling \$875,000 from various foundations. She has read professional papers and served as a consultant for Science Education in Ethiopia, Lebanon, Italy, Germany, Scotland and, in May of 1981, at the Interamerican Very Special Arts Festival and Symposium in Celebration of the Year of the Disabled Child — U.S., Latin America, South America and Carribean — Disney World. Author of two textbooks, four workbooks on the Mainstreaming Approach to Laboratory Science and Art for Blind, Deaf and Emotionally Disturbed Children, she has published also several educational and scientific studies in learned and popular journals. Her work has been publicized through radio broadcasts and documentary films throughout the world, having received, among other honors, the American Film Festival Blue Ribbon Award in 1980. Having lived in at least 20 countries, she is indeed a citizen of the world carrying to the world the example of a woman and a scholar whose life attests to her vision of compassionate service — misericordia — upon which this College was founded.
