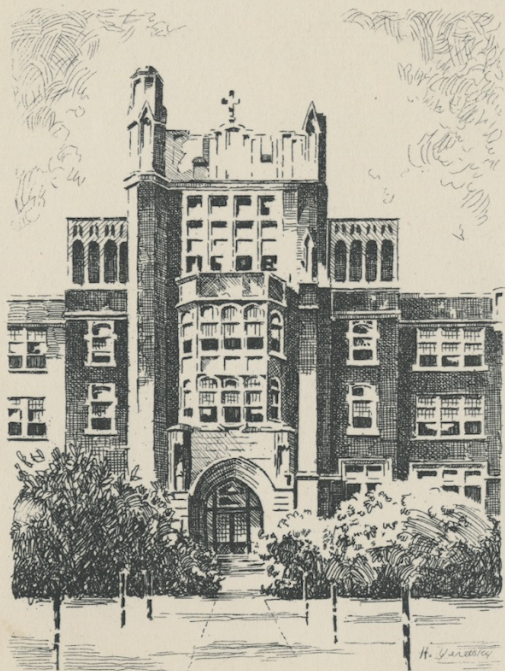

THE SESSION MUST BEGIN PROMPTLY

That the students may get the full number of exercises announced for the session, all work must begin promptly on Monday morning, June 24.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Classes will meet five days a week, and lectures will begin each morning at 9:00. Classes are not held on Saturday.

Six credits may be earned in the summer as the session is for six weeks.

Any course not listed will be given, if at least seven students apply for it.

The work of the summer session is approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Public Instruction.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the summer session is to afford instruction in college subjects to students, teachers, and others who are qualified to do college work, but who cannot avail themselves of the regular sessions of the college, and also to give students in the regular sessions the opportunity of securing additional credits or removing conditions.
